Prior to DB Capital, he was a Managing Partner at McCown De Leeuw & Co., Inc., a \$1.2 billion private equity fund. From 1987 to 1991, he was a Managing Partner at HMA Investments, Inc., a private investment firm focused on middle market management buyouts. He also worked in the M&A Department at Lazard Freres & Co. and the Corporate Finance Group at Kidder Peabody & Co. He is currently on the Board of the Lenox Hill Neighborhood House and the Special Projects Committee of Memorial Sloan Kettering Hospital and is an active member of YPO, the Young Presidents' Organization, Gotham Chapter. # Trilantic North America Advisory Board

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- **STEPHEN M. WOLF** (*Chairman*) assumed his current position as chairman of R. R. Donnelley & Sons Company in March 2004. He has been the managing partner of Alpillles, LLC, since 2003. Before becoming managing partner of Alpillles, Mr. Wolf was chairman of US Airways. Mr. Wolf was chairman and chief executive officer of US Airways from 1996 until 1998 when he turned over his chief executive officer title to another executive. Prior to joining US Airways, Mr. Wolf had served since 1994 as senior advisor to Lazard Freres & Company. From 1987 until it was purchased by its employees in July 1994, he was chairman and chief executive officer of UAL Corporation and United Airlines, Inc. Mr. Wolf's aviation career began in 1966 with American Airlines, where he rose to the position of vice president of the western division. He joined Pan American World Airways as a senior vice president in 1981 and became president and chief operating officer of Continental Airlines in 1982. In 1984, he became president and chief executive officer of Republic Airlines, where he served until 1986 at which time he orchestrated the company's merger with Northwest Airlines. Thereafter, he served as chairman and chief executive officer of Tiger International, Inc. and The Flying Tiger Line, Inc. where he oversaw the sale of the company to Federal Express. Mr. Wolf serves as a member of the board of directors of R. R. Donnelley & Sons Company, Philip Morris International, Chrysler Group, LLC and is an Honorary Trustee of The Brookings Institution. Mr. Wolf holds a B.A. degree in sociology from San Francisco State University.
- **T. COLEMAN ANDREWS** is the CEO and Chief Investment Officer of Rocky Mountain Wealth Concepts ("RMWC"), a proprietary investment enterprise managing funds in equity and credit markets. RMWC primarily serves high net worth individuals and families, and their related investment entities. From 2005 to 2010, Mr. Andrews was also CEO of Rocky Mountain Bank, a financial services enterprise, and he served as an advisor to several private equity funds. From 1998 to 2001, Mr. Andrews served the governments of Presidents Nelson Mandela and Thabo Mbeki of South Africa in leading the strategic, tactical, and financial turnaround of South African Airways, a global company with 10,500 employees and operations in 34 countries. From 1994 to 1997, Mr. Andrews ran for the office of Lt. Governor of Virginia, eventually withdrawing due to family obligations while leading the race. During this time, he was appointed by Governor George Allen to Virginia's Commission for Citizen Empowerment, which developed the strategy that led to a successful overhaul of Virginia's welfare policies. From 1986 to 1997, he was Chairman or CEO of World Airways, where he led a successful turnaround while navigating the effects of the Gulf War and a severe industry recession. Mr. Andrews was awarded the Civilian Desert Shield/Desert Storm Medal in 1991 by the United States Air Force for volunteer service in the war zone during the Gulf War. From 1983 to 1986, Mr. Andrews was Co-Founding Partner of Bain Capital, which has developed into one of the nation's top private equity firms. Between 1978 and 1982, he progressed from Associate to Partner of Bain & Company during a key stage in the development of the international strategy consulting firm. Mr. Andrews served in the White House from 1975 to 1977, where he was ultimately appointed as Staff Assistant to the President for Economic Affairs. He holds an M.B.A. from Stanford University, where he was named an Arjay Miller Scholar, and he graduated, *magna cum laude*, from Dartmouth College with High Honors in Economics and as a Rufus Choate Scholar.

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- **LORD KENNETH BAKER C.H.** (Chairman of the Europe Advisory Council of Trilantic Europe) was a Conservative Member of Parliament from 1968 to 1997. He was the first Minister for Information Technology, responsible for introducing computers into schools, privatizing British Telecom and Cable & Wireless, and establishing the cable industry. His Cabinet posts included Environment Secretary, Education Secretary, Home Secretary and he was Chairman of the Conservative Party. Lord Baker is currently the Chairman of Graphite Resources Ltd. He is the Deputy Chairman of Genting UK Plc. He is Vice-Chairman of The Cartoon Museum; a Trustee of the Man Booker Prize Foundation; and Chairman of the educational charities Edge Foundation and The Baker Dearing Educational Trust which is promoting the establishment of University Technical Colleges in the UK. He has written several books. He was created a Companion of Honour in 1992 and awarded a peerage in 1997.
- **SUSAN M. CAMERON** served as Chairman and CEO of Reynolds American Inc., a publicly traded company with \$8 billion in sales, from 2006 to 2011, when she retired. Prior to that, she was President and CEO from 2004 to 2006. Before serving as President and CEO of Brown & Williamson Tobacco Corp. from 2001 to 2004, Ms. Cameron held a 10-year series of international assignments with Brown & Williamson's parent company, British American Tobacco plc. Ms. Cameron started her career in 1981 as a Trade Marketing Representative and held various consumer marketing roles over the subsequent 19 years. She is currently on the Board at Tupperware Brands Corp. (NYSE: TUP) and RR Donnelly & Sons Company (NYSE: RRD) and a Trustee on the University of Florida Board. Ms. Cameron previously served on the Women's Leadership Initiative for the United Way of America; Community Chair of annual United Way campaigns for Winston-Salem, NC, and Louisville, KY and United Way board member; Boards of Trustees of Wake Forest University, Salem College and Bellarmine University; and the Boards of Directors of Winston-Salem YWCA and Senior Services Inc. Ms. Cameron received an M.B.A. from Bellarmine University and a B.S. in Business Administration from the University of Florida.
- **JOHN H. DASBURG** is Chairman, Chief Executive Officer and co-owner of ASTAR Air Cargo, Inc. Previously he was Chairman, President and Chief Executive Officer of Burger King Corporation. During his tenure at Burger King, he led a turnaround of the company that culminated in its 2002 sale. Prior to joining Burger King, Mr. Dasburg served 10 years as President and Chief Executive Officer of Northwest Airlines, the world's fourth largest airline. Before his airline career, he served as President of Marriott's Lodging Group and executive vice president and CFO of Marriott Corp. Prior to his tenure at Marriott, he was a partner with KPMG, an international CPA firm. Mr. Dasburg received a B.A. in engineering, an M.B.A. and a J.D., all from the University of Florida. He served three years in the U.S. Navy with one year in Vietnam and rose to the rank of Lieutenant Commander in the U.S. Navy Reserves. He was appointed in 1991 by President George Bush to the White House Fellows Committee. He is Chairman of the Advisory Board for the School of International Relations and Pacific Studies at the University of California at San Diego, and a member of the Board of Directors of The Chief Executives' Organization and the Reason Foundation. He also serves on the Advisory Board of the Scripps Institute of Oceanography and spent eight years on the Board of Trustees of the Institute of Americas where he served as Chairman until he resigned to enter the U.S. Government as an Assistant Secretary of Commerce for Trade Development in 1992. In that capacity, he was an ex-officio member of the Board of Directors of the Overseas Private Investment Corporation and on the Board of Directors of the Export Import Bank as well as a member of the President's Export Council and Board of the Committee for Foreign Investment in the U.S. He was also a member of the U.S. Polish Action Commission chaired by Zbigniew Brezezinski which is involved in the economic development of Poland. Mr. Jameson served as the International President of the Young Presidents' Organization in 1989/90 and was selected for a Presidential Business Mission by President Bush in 1990 to attend the Helsinki Summit and to go to Moscow to discuss economic development with President Gorbachev and Foreign Minister Shevardnaze. Mr. Jameson graduated from Stanford University with both a B.A. and M.B.A.
- **THOMAS S. JOHNSON** served as Chairman & Chief Executive Officer of GreenPoint Financial Corp. & GreenPoint Bank from 1993 until he retired in 2004. Furthermore, Mr Mesonero is the former Vice President of Radiotrónica, telecom company and the former CEO and President of the Board of Ebro Puleva, one of the biggest food companies worldwide and leader in the Spanish market.
- **BURKHARD SCHUCHMANN** is Vice-Chairman of Talgo. From 1986 to 2005, he was CEO of Vossloh AG, which he developed from a family-owned conglomerate with EUR 90 million revenues to one of the global leading and listed companies in the railway industry with more than EUR 1 billion in sales. Prior to his engagement at Vossloh AG, Mr. Schuchmann served 8 years in leading positions at Bayerische Elektrizitätswerke and further 8 years as CFO at Knuerr AG.
